Learn how to help pregnant smokers quit



Smoking Cessation and Reduction in Pregnancy Treatment (SCRIPT) is an award-winning, evidence-based program that has helped thousands of pregnant women quit smoking. It is designed to be a component of a patient education program delivered by health Providers. It is cited by the Agency for Healthcare Research & Quality's Smoking Cessation Clinical Practice Guidelines.



Adopting SCRIPT in Your Organization is a one-day train-the-trainer workshop for health professionals. It will provide participants with the skills they need to implement the SCRIPT program as part of routine prenatal care. Participants will learn how to assess pregnant women for smoking; conduct a SCRIPT counseling session; receive the SCRIPT counseling materials; organize and train staff; promote the SCRIPT program to administrators, medical staff, health educators, social workers, and others; and evaluate the effectiveness of SCRIPT.
